



HOMESPUN®

Knitted Americana Hat and Scarf



Skill Level: Easy**SIZES**

Adult: Hat 24" circumference Scarf 8 1/2" x 70"

Child: Hat Size 6-8 - 20" circumference Scarf 6" x 45"

MATERIALS

For Adult or Child

- LION BRAND Homespun
- 1 skein #307 Antique or #325 Cascade (A)
- 1 skein #309 Deco (B)
- 1 skein #302 Colonial (C) or colors of your choice
- Size 10.5 (6.5 mm) needle or size to obtain gauge
- Large-eyed yarn needle

Optional Star Trim

- LION BRAND Wool-Ease
- 1 ball #099 Fisherman or color of your choice OR
- LION BRAND Wool-Ease Sportweight
- 1 ball #099 Fisherman or color of your choice OR
- White star buttons or emblems as desired
- Size H-8 (5 mm) hook if using Wool-Ease, Size F-5 (3.75 mm) is using Wool-

Ease Sportweight (Note Wool-Ease Sportweight will make smaller stars.)

GAUGE

12 sts + 24 rows = 4" (10 cm) in garter stitch (k every row). BE SURE TO CHECK GAUGE.

ADULT VERSION

HAT (worked flat, then seamed)

With C, cast on 72 sts. Work in St st (k 1 row, p 1 row) for 3". *Change to B and k 4 rows, then k 4 rows A. Rep from * once. K 2 rows B. Cont stripes as established and SHAPE CROWN. Next row (row 3 B) K 5, k2tog, *k 6, k2tog; rep from *, end k 1 - 63 sts. Knit 3 rows. Next row K 4, k2tog, *k 5, k2tog; rep from *, end k 1 - 54 sts. Knit 3 rows. Next row K 3, k2tog, *k 4, k2tog; rep from *, end k 1 - 45 sts. Knit 3 rows. Next row K 2, k2tog, *k 3, k2tog; rep from *, end k 1 - 36 sts. Knit 3 rows. Next row K 1, k2tog, *k 2, k2tog; rep from *, end k 1 - 27 sts. Knit 1 row. Next row *K 1, k2tog; rep from * - 18 sts. Knit 1 row. Next 2 rows K2tog across. Pull yarn through rem sts. Sew side seam.

SCARF

NOTE Scarf is worked in 2 sections.

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Striped section With A, cast on 174 sts. Knit 4 rows. Change to B and knit 4 rows. Continue to alternate 4 rows A, 4 rows B, until you have completed 13 stripes. Bind off loosely.

Field for Stars Turn stripes vertically. With C, pick up 26 sts along end (1 st for every garter ridge). Knit every row until Field measures 12" from beg. Bind off.

Sew Stars as desired.

STARS (make 8)

Ch 3, slip st to form ring.

Rnd 1 Ch 1, work 5 sc in ring, slip st to beg ch.

Rnd 2 Ch 1, work 3 sc in each sc, slip st to beg ch - 15 sc.

Rnd 3 *Sc in first sc, ch 5, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in last ch, skip 2 sc; rep from * around, end with slip st to first sc. Fasten off.

CHILD VERSION

HAT

HAT (worked flat, then seamed)

With C, cast on 60 sts. Work in St. st (k 1 row, p 1 row) for 2 1/2". *Change to B and knit 4 rows, then knit 4 rows A, 4 row B. Knit 2 rows A. Cont stripes as established and SHAPE CROWN Next row (row 3 A) K 3, k2tog, *k 4, k2tog; rep from *, end k 1 - 50 sts. Knit 3 rows. Next row K 2, k2tog, *k 3, k2tog; rep from *, end k 1 - 40 sts. Knit 3 rows. Next row K 1, k2tog, *k 2, k2tog; rep from *, end k 1 - 30 sts. Knit 3 rows. Next row *K 1, k2tog; rep from * - 20 sts. Knit 1 row. Next 2 rows K2tog across. Pull yarn through rem sts. Sew side seam.

SCARF

NOTE Scarf is worked in 2 sections.

Striped section With A, cast on 112 sts. Knit 4 rows. Change to B and knit 4 rows. Continue to alternate 4 rows A, 4 rows B, until you have completed 9 stripes. Bind off loosely.

Field for Stars Turn stripes vertically. With C, pick up 18 sts along end (1 st for every garter ridge). Knit every row until Field measures 8" from beg. Bind off.

Sew Stars as desired.

STARS (make 7)

Work as for adult version.

beg = begin(ning)	p = purl
ch = chain	rem = remain(s)(ing)
cont = continu(e)(ing)	rep= repeat(s)(ing)
dc = double crochet	RS = right side
hdc = half double crochet	Sc = single crochet
k = knit	st(s) - stitch(es)
k2tog = knit two together	St st = Stockinette stitch

Homespun (Article #790) comes in 6 oz/185 yd skeins

Wool-Ease (Article #620) solid, sprinkles, heather, and twist colors come in 3 oz/197 yd balls; prints, frosts, and glitter/multi colors come in 2 1/2 oz/162 yd balls

Wool-Ease Sportweight (Article #660) comes in 5 oz/435 yd balls
